Welcome back to the cottage for 2016.

After a winter of modest snowfalls and some early spring days with temperatures in the shorts-and-t-shirts range, I'm sure you are as anxious to get back into the cottage season as I am. And after seeing the first eager water-skiers pass my dock on April 17th, we know that summer fun is not far away.

A few heavy rainfalls and excessive runoff in late March surprised many cottage areas with higher than expected water levels. Our neighbours in the Muskoka Lakes area experienced major ice damage to boathouses and shoreline structures. This damage was caused by the high water level, which allowed large ice floes to blow into the structures.

While still high, the water levels in Sparrow Lake are gradually declining. When the water was at its highest, many cottage waterfronts were left with lots of debris, including relocated dock sections, chairs, and water toys. Please be cautious around your shorelines. If you do discover anything missing or found, we may be able to connect you with the other party. Send us a note with the description and your contact information, and the Sparrow Lake Association (SLA) can send out an email blast to help with the recovery.

Spring also is the start of your cottage outdoor cleanup, raking, and burning. As our friends on Lion's Head Road pointed out, April 2016 marks the third anniversary of the loss of three area cottages due to carelessness (one on McLean Bay and two on the Seven River).

It took 14 trips with a water bomber, 30 men, and seven vehicles from the fire department, paramedics, OPP, and MNR to keep the fires from causing even more damage. We still lost these buildings, plus 3.1 hectares of forest floor.

Please respect the fire ban laws, ensure you obtain the appropriate fire permits, and obey the burning rules, times, and specific burning requirements for your respective townships. Muskoka Township calls for night burning only, while Severn Township permits burning only during daylight hours.

Your SLA Board members continue to keep up to speed on the latest events with the federal, provincial, and local municipal governments. Much of our information comes to us via the Federation of Ontario Cottage Associations (FOCA). I urge you to look at the [FOCA](#) website. Several of their current topics are linked to this newsletter.

Water testing, water quality, and weed observation are key elements monitored by the SLA and all cottage associations. The water testing facility in Orillia is currently not testing lake water quality, but we are in the process of connecting with an alternate facility until the one in Orillia is back in operation. SLA conducts water testing on specific areas in Sparrow Lake, Deep and McLean Bays, and the Severn River. Any significant results will be shared with our members.

I also encourage you to view the [Sparrow Lake Association website](#). It's a great tool for checking dates, activities and information about **your** cottage group. I also ask that all members promote the benefits of being a member to your neighbours. Not only is the \$30/year (or \$75 for 3 years) cover a cost-effective family admission to the Regatta, membership fees are also used towards the costs of testing and monitoring water quality, staying connected to FOCA, and covering prizes and awards for the Regatta.

I hope you all have a great 2016 cottage season! Please do join us for the annual Regatta and Fishing Derby (see the reports in this newsletter).

I look forward to seeing you throughout the summer.
